

A Young Artists Perspective

This book examines the relationship between the fine arts and economics –the contribution of various art forms toward economic growth and development, and the impact of economic factors on the creation of art. Xavier Greffe identifies the economic factors that can affect the emergence, flourishing, and disappearance of artistic activities. He begins with an analysis of the artistic markets where the players cannot be measured by standard economic yardsticks. The cast of characters include users who are initially unaware of the kind of satisfaction they can gain from unknown works of art, producers who do not know whether their upfront costs in the commissioning of new art and design will be covered, and the artists who are more interested in letting the creative muse guide their endeavors than in creating specifically defined works on demand. The book then explores the various dynamics that influence the development of the artistic sector: a revolving compromise between heritage and creation; a continuous passage between an original work of art and the products of cultural industries; and a permanent shift between profit and nonprofit institutions. Greffe provides a way to evaluate art from an economic perspective –that explains both the creation and development of creative movement, without judging the existence of works of art only in terms of economic logic.

This book is the seventh in the Readings in Conservation series, which gathers and publishes texts that have been influential in the development of thinking about the conservation of cultural heritage. The present volume provides a selection of more than ninety-five texts tracing the development of the conservation of works of art on paper. Comprehensive and thorough, the book relates how paper conservation has responded to the changing place of prints and drawings in society. The readings include a remarkable range of historical selections from texts such as Renaissance printmaker Ugo da Carpi's sixteenth-century petition to the Venetian senate on his invention of chiaroscuro, Thomas Churchyard's 1588 essay in verse "A Sparke of Frenship and Warne Goodwill," and Robert Bell's 1773 piece "Observations Relative to the Manufacture of Paper and Printed Books in the Province of Pennsylvania." Each reading is introduced by short remarks explaining the rationale for its selection and the principal matters covered, and the book is supplemented with a helpful bibliography. INTRODUCTION In my career as an art teacher, which extends over a period of many years, I have often been impressed with the deficiency in even a moderate knowledge of perspective on the part of young artists, who, in a general way, were possessed of considerable ability,

but for some reason or other had failed to enter into the study of this branch of art, which teaches the underlying principles upon which all object drawing is founded. Strange as it may seem, I have often heard artists speak flippantly about perspective, even to the extent that some declared it is not necessary for an artist to trouble himself about studying perspective, because they believe that by the continued practice of drawing sufficient knowledge of its principles can be acquired to answer all practical purposes. That some facility is acquired without any special study in this way is undoubtedly true; yet is it not equally true that while some, whose perceptive faculties are more acute than those of others, may acquire a fair degree of accuracy in drawing, many gain but little and spoil much of their work--which in everything else may be very clever, but sadly defective in drawing---through blunders made by reason of the want of knowledge of perspective? I have often been asked by students to recommend a text-book on perspective, and was ever at a loss which to advise, some being so elementary that they do not carry the practical application far enough, while others are based upon the assumption that the student is sufficiently versed in geometry and projection to comprehend the more advanced and scientific treatise, which, however, in the absence of such preparation, is utterly unintelligible to the beginner. The present volume, Publications of The Metropolitan Museum of Art, 1964-2005, is a successor to a volume published by the Museum in 1965 entitled Publications of The Metropolitan Museum of Art, 1870-1964. These two bibliographic volumes endeavor to list all the known books, pamphlets, and serial publications bearing the Museum's imprint, and issued by the institution during the first 135 years of its existence (through June 2005). The first volume was compiled by Albert TenEyck Gardner, at the time an Associate Curator of American Paintings and Sculpture, and the present volume has been compiled from the Annual Reports issued by the Museum during the relevant years. Together the two volumes testify to the tremendous contributions made to knowledge by the curators and conservators of the Metropolitan and by the many other experts who have contributed to the Museum's exhibition catalogues. Various issues of the Bulletin emphasize the great sweep of the Museum's acquisitions during these years, and the exhibition catalogues—a number of them Alfred H. Barr Jr., Award or the George Wittenborn Award—testify to the continuity of the institution's dedicated program to enrich people's lives through knowledge of art. The essays selected for this book, presented in chronological order, discuss various aspects of image-making technologies, geometrical knowledge and tools for architectural design, focusing in particular on two historical periods marked by comparable patterns of technological and cultural change. The first is the Renaissance; characterized by the rediscovery of linear perspectives and the simultaneous rise of new formats for architectural drawing and design on paper; the second, the contemporary rise of digital technologies and the simultaneous rise of virtual reality and computer-based design and manufacturing. Many of the contributing authors explore the parallel between the invention of the perspectival paradigm in early-modern Europe and the recent development of digitized virtual reality. This issue in turn bears on the specific purposes of architectural design, where various representational tools and devices are used to visualize bi-dimensional aspects

of objects that must be measured and eventually built in three-dimensional space.
